

Never Saw Me Coming by Vera Kurian. (2021). Chloe is a first-year student at university. She's an ordinary girl who happens to be a diagnosed psychopath with a very high IQ and her main goal is to kill a boy named Will. Chloe is part of a secret clinical study run by the university's psychology department for students who are



psychopaths. Chloe's private vendetta is temporarily sidelined when a string of murders at the campus causes panic. Chloe partners with fellow study participants (that she can't trust) to work out who the murderer is...

I thought that this novel was a great debut for the author. It was an original idea for a storyline, not something I've ever come across before that I can recall, and I found it entertaining. While the synopsis only refers to Chloe, the book swaps perspectives often, primarily between Chloe and two other participants of the secret study, Charles and Andre. I found all three intriguing for different reasons. I must admit it felt a bit odd to be hoping for Chloe's murder plans to work out haha, but the psychopath students were very charismatic, and I think readers will agree that one can't help but be drawn to them.

Overall: happily recommend this book for any fans of the thriller genre.

Mr Arthur Leslie Leggett, OAM, EB

Do you know a former local resident who is 103 years old and a WW11 veteran?

Mr Arthur Leslie Leggett, OAM, EB served in World War II in the 2/11 Infantry Battalion 6 Division.

Mr Arthur Leggett was born in 1918 in Sydney and came to Perth in 1934. Arthur enlisted in the AIF in 1939. Arthur guarded the Maylands Aerodrome and went on the Duntroon ship to the eastern states and on to Palestine in February 1940 for training in desert

warfare. Arthur became a signaller. He was sent to Greece and finished at Crete and was made a Prisoner of War when the island capitulated. He was held in a civilian jail under poor conditions. He was sent to Munich and worked there for eighteen months before moving to

Poland, then Brussels on liberation and then onto England. In 2004 he received the Order of Australia for services to veterans and their families through the Ex-Prisoner of War Association of WA. Arthur and Eileen Leggett lived in Bayswater for forty years and moved to Eden Hill in Bassendean in 1996 and Arthur lived there until 2017. He is President of the EX-POW Association of WA. In 2012 Mr Leggett spoke at the Town of Bassendean Anzac Day ceremony. In 2018 the Mt

Lawley Senior High School chose to mark Arthur's centenary by naming the school library after him. Mrs Eileen Edith Leggett died in 2009.




