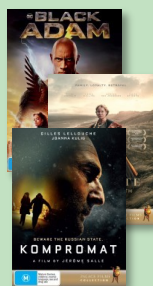

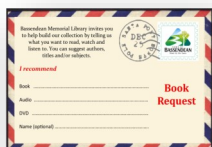
The gilded age (2022)

The American Gilded Age was a period of immense economic change, great conflict between the old ways and brand new systems, and huge fortunes were

made and lost. In 1882, young Marian Brook moves from rural Pennsylvania to New York City after the death of her father to live with her aunts Agnes van Rhijn and Ada Brook. Accompanied by Peggy Scott, an aspiring writer seeking a fresh start, Marian inadvertently becomes enmeshed in a social war between one of her aunts, a scion of the old money set, and her stupendously rich neighbors, a ruthless railroad tycoon and his ambitious wife, George and Bertha Russell. Exposed to a world on the brink of the modern age, Marian must choose if she will follow the established rules of society or forge her own path.

The Janes by Louisa Luna. (2020)

On the outskirts of San Diego, the bodies of two young women are discovered. They are Jane Does: no names, no IDs and no families looking for them. Fearing a human trafficking ring, the police and FBI ask Alice Vega to help find out who the Janes were – and find the other missing women before it is too late.

I loved the first novel in this Alice Vega series, and it completely slipped past me that there is now a second AND a third! This is the second book and it is just as good as the first, and it can also be read as a standalone. With a very confronting concept of young girls being sex trafficked, it's a dark themed narrative. Alice teams up once again with Max, and they complement each other very well. With a fast pace and lots of action, this is one to shut out the world and race through the pages.

50th anniversary of the end of Australia's involvement in the Vietnam War

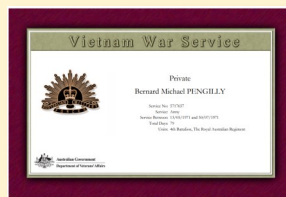
In 2023, the Australian Government will mark the 50th anniversary of the end of Australia's involvement in the Vietnam War with a National Commemorative Service in Canberra on 18 August 2023. Throughout the year, Australians will be encouraged to honour and remember the service of some 60,000 Australian men and women who served in the Vietnam War. Tragically, 523 Australians lost their lives in the war, and over 3,000 were wounded.

The Department of Veterans' Affairs will deliver a televised commemorative service to mark the 50th anniversary of the end of Australia's involvement in the Vietnam War at the Australian Vietnam Forces National Memorial on Anzac Parade, on Friday 18 August 2023.

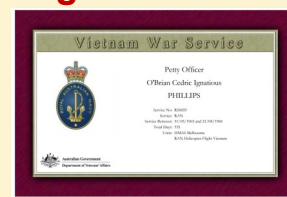

Lest We Forget



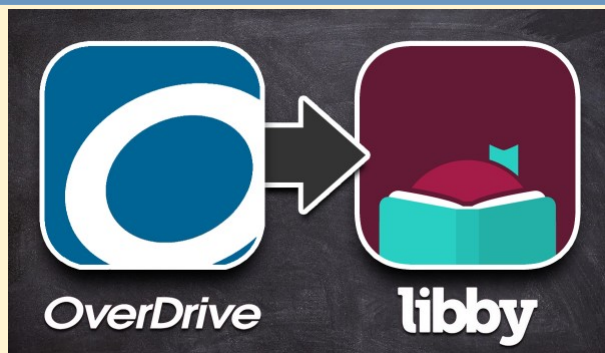
Bassendean resident Private Bernard Pengilly, was killed in action on 30 July 1971 and served in 4th Battalion, Royal Australian Regiment in the Vietnam War. He is buried in the Perth War Cemetery and was the son of Alfred and Phyllis Pengilly.
