The Whale (2022)

In the 1950s, Alice and Jack live in the idealized community of Victory, an

experimental company town that houses the men who work on a top-secret project. The Seven Skins of Esther Wildling by Holly Ringland. (2022) The last time Esther's beloved older sister Aura was seen. she was walking along the shore towards the sea. Her family struggle with their loss. To seek the truth about Aura's death, Esther reluctantly travels from Lutruwita, Tasmania to Copenhagen, and then to the Faroe Islands, following the trail of the stories Aura left behind: seven fairytales about selkies, swans and women, alongside cryptic verses Aura wrote and had secretly tattooed on her body.



It is not often a book will genuinely bring me to tears, but this one did in a couple of parts. The author has such a way with words, depicting raw emotion so easily, that readers cannot help but be affected. I quite enjoyed the myths/legends/stories told throughout the book, with Aura having a special connection to them. I appreciated the exploration of tattoos being a way of women telling their stories. The storyline also looks at the complicated relationships we can have with our loved ones, and the things we hide to protect either them or ourselves.
