The Little Wartime Library

by Kate Thompson. (2022) London, 1944. Clara is no ordinary librarian – while the world remains at war, she has created the

country's only underground library, built over the tracks in a disused tube station. Down here a whole community thrives with thousands of bunk beds, a nursery, a café and a theatre. The library is the beating heart of life underground. But as the war drags on, Clara and her glamorous best friend/library assistant Ruby's determination to stay strong is tested when it seems to be at the price of keeping those closest to them alive.

I really enjoyed this historical fiction which is based on true events. Love love love the concept of an underground library – the reasoning behind needing it at the time is horrible and makes for emotional reading at times but it is has an uplifting tone. The perspectives alternate between librarian Clara and her best friend/library assistant Ruby. I particularly enjoyed that the storyline often focused on the love readers had for their books – the children listening at storytime and the adults using reading to escape the horrific events at the time. Clara and Ruby are very likeable leads and there is a large cast of supporting characters whose antics mean that readers will fly through the pages.

Overall: happily and highly recommend this gripping and engaging novel for any reader who enjoys historical fiction and/or novels that show a deep appreciation for librarians and literature. - One Woman's brief book reviews
