

Juice by Tim Winton

An epic novel of determination, survival and the limits of the human spirit. Tim Winton is one of Australia's literary heavyweights and a well-loved local author. In Juice, he breaks new ground to face the climate emergency in a dystopian landscape not far removed from our current reality. Every machine-tooled sentence is its own reward and the sheer length of the novel becomes its greatest pleasure. Winton drives Juice towards its conclusion with a narrative force that feels almost cyclonic.
