



This book is based on Wanjoo, the Welcome song, which is written, performed and taught by Balladong (Noongar) singer-songwriter Gina Williams. Orugunall written for Gina's three children, Wanjoo has been performed and taught to 40,000 people across Australia and around

the world.

It has also been translated into Wajarri (Geraldton) and Malgana (Shark Bay) languages.

It is hoped that one day this song will be translated into lots of local Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander dialects all over Australia; because these are the first languages of this land and we should be singing them because we live here.
