


Home Energy Audit Kit









Do-It-Yourself Home Energy Audits are now available to borrow at Bassendean Library.

Each energy audit kit includes:

- A thermal imaging camera to help you locate draughts around your home and gaps in insulation, for checking fridge seals, and measuring hot water temperature.
- A plug-in energy monitor for measuring energy consumption and the running costs of appliances.
- A basin flow measuring cup to determine the water flow rate of your taps
- A thermometer for measuring the temperature of rooms, fridges and freezers.
- An instructional manual which explains how to conduct a variety of tests, tips to reduce your energy and water use, instructions on how to use the equipment and safety information.

Free in-person and online workshops on reducing energy use, solar panels, electric vehicles and more.
