FOGO is coming!

You may have heard the term FOGO being used more and more but what does it actually mean? FOGO stands for Food Organic and Garden Organics.

FOGO is considered any food waste including fruit and vegetable scraps, processed food and leftovers from meals such as meat, fish, chicken, bread, egg, egg shells, dairy products, coffee grounds and tea bags. Garden waste can include grass clippings, flowers and herbs, small branches and leaves. Paper towels, compostable plates, and soiled cardboard, such as used pizza boxes, can also be disposed of through a FOGO service.

The Town of Bassendean will be rolling out three bins in July 2020.

Lime green lid: Food scraps, organic garden waste and other organic waste

Yellow lid bin: Recyclable items

Red lid bin: For general waste that can not be recycled

The new three bin system will enable the Town to meet important waste reduction targets set by the WA Government for a 75% diversion of waste from landfill.

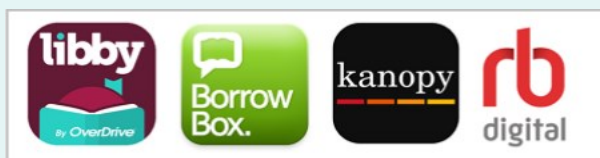
