Mare of Easttown- limited TV series (7 episodes)

Mare Sheehan (Kate Winslet), a police officer in a small town somewhere in Pennsylvania, is

investigating a brutal murder of a young mother. She knows everyone in town and has to investigate movements and motives of her friends and family while maintaining professional objectivity and dealing with problems and challenges of her everyday life.

A brilliant character study of a complicated woman with complicated life, of friendship and grief, of family connections and struggle to come to terms with tragedy. It is not possible not to get emotionally involved with the characters and wanting to know how this small town will deal with the consequences of tragic events. All performances are truly brilliant and Kate Winslet is simply outstanding. I was glued to the screen, committed to the bitter end.

Not to be missed- it's more than a murder RP mystery.

The Maidens by Alex Michaelides. (2021).

St Christopher's College, Cambridge, is a closed world to most. For Mariana, a group therapist

struggling through grief, it's where she met her late husband. For her niece Zoe, it's where her best friend just got murdered. As memory and mystery entangle Mariana, she finds a society full of secrets. Behind it's idyllic beauty is a web of jealousy and rage which comes from an exclusive female group of students known as The Maidens, who seem to be under the sinister influence of the enigmatic professor Edward. A man who seems to know

more than anyone about the murders and the victims. He becomes the prime suspect to Mariana and she is quickly obsessed.

After loving this author's debut novel (The Silent Patient), I was really looking forward to seeing what was next. I'm happy to report that I think this novel is also a great story. It is the kind of book you won't want to put down because you just want to race to the end to find out all the secrets. I thought the twist near the end was clever, particularly with some obvious and subtle red herrings thrown in along the way. As per normal when a person all of a sudden decides they are an investigator, Mariana made some questionable decisions after immediately deciding Edward is the murderer which gets her in some awkward and sticky situations. It's all complicated by the fact that Mariana is still deeply grieving the loss of her beloved husband. I wouldn't be surprised if this book gets optioned for film rights because it would play out fabulously on the screen. Overall: I would happily recommend this novel for anyone that enjoys psychological thrillers, and I'll definitely be keeping an eye out for future books from this author.
