A drama about one of New York's most prestigious ad agencies at the beginning of the 1960s, focusing on one of the firm's most mysterious but extremely talented ad executives, Don Draper. 


Local Studies Collection

Bassendean Dairies.



Local dairies provided daily milk supplies to families until the devastating infectious disease Rinderpest impacted local dairies in the 1920's.

Bassendean was ideally suited for agriculture with alluvial soil and access to the river for transport and complimentary local industries were attracted.

Many families grew their own food and vineyards and plant nurseries were established in the district. Many people had double blocks with a paddock for their horse and large vegetable patches.



An early dairy was Frank Honner's Tatiara Dairy on Parnell Parade c1909.



Richard Purser and Company, based in Bassendean, produced and sold farm equipment including chaff cutters, milk separators and butter churns.

Did you know straying stock was a common problem and features regularly in the early West Guildford Road Board minutes? Solutions were to improve fencing, impound stock and create the position of the Pound Keeper in 1948.



As early as 1882, straying stock was reported on the Bassendean Estate. Daily News 19 October 1882, p. 4


We have many brochures for services and activities tailored to our Seniors that are available from aisle 7 (the large print section).




Water damaged books
